In Hand showing: Ring 1 (ARENA) 9 am	
1) Open in Hand	Any age / height / breed
2) In Hand Hunter & Sport Horse Type	Any age / height
3) In Hand Mountain & Moorland to include Part-bred	Any age / height (see list of eligible breeds below)
4) In Hand Cob Type	Any age / height
5) In Hand Veteran	Horse 18 years and over Any height / breed
6) In Hand Coloured, Spotted & Palomino	Any age / height
7) In Hand Warmblood, Rare & Foreign Breeds	Any age / height (see below for list of breeds)
8) In Hand Best Condition	Any age / height
<i>IN HAND SHOWING CHAMPIONSHIP – CLASSES 1 – 8</i>	
All riders placed 1 st or 2 nd in classes 1-8 are invited to enter the In Hand Showing Championship. This class is FREE to enter.	
9) Bonny Pony / Horse	27 May
Neatest and Cleanest (In Hand)	29 July
Nicest Mane & Tail (In Hand)	2 Sept
Any horse, any age or height, and handler any age	
<i>Class 9 £3 per entry to fundraise for good causes, rosettes to 10th place (see Secretary's Tent for further details)</i>	
The judge will have a break before the Ridden Classes in the arena commence.	

* Mountain & Moorland (Classes 3 & 24): Connemara, Dales, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Fell, Highland, New Forest, Shetland, Welsh Section A, B, C & D. This class will accept part-breds.

Ridden Showing: Ring 1 (ARENA) Not to start before 12:30pm

10) Green Horse Ridden Showing	Horse any height. Walk & trot only. Aimed at green horses, young & novice horses. May only enter this class for ONE season. It is aimed at genuine green horses.
11) Novice Ridden Showing	Snaffle bridle only. Horse any height. Aimed at people new to showing.
12) Open Ridden Showing	Horse any height. Double-bridle permitted.
13) Ridden Veteran	Horse 18 years and over
14) Worldly Rider	Ridden Showing for mature riders aged 50+
15) Novice Equitation*	Horse any height. No spurs to be worn. Rider not to have won 1 st in any equitation class. Snaffle bridle only
16) Open Equitation*	Snaffle bridle only, horse any height. Rider any age, no spurs to be worn
17) Concours d'Élégance	May be ridden side-saddle or astride. Will be judged on period costume. (see ODRC website for rules and tips for this class)

*Please note if you enter the Open Equitation Class you cannot also enter the Novice Equitation unless you enter the Novice Equitation Class as a non-competitor, irrespective of whether you are riding a different horse. This class is judged on the RIDER and not the horse.

Working Hunter: RING 2 (FIELD) 9.30 AM

18) Beginners – Nervous & Novice (see * & ** below)	No spurs. Not to have been placed 1 st in any Working Hunter class. Jump Height 30cm (1' 0")
19) Mini Novice Working Hunter (see * & ** below)	Horse any height. Jump height 60cm (2' 0"). No spurs to be worn. Combination of horse & rider not to have won any Working Hunter class
20) Novice Working Hunter**	Horse any height. Jump height 80cm (2' 6"). No spurs to be worn
21) Intermediate Working Hunter	Horse any height. Jump height 90cm (3' 0")
22) Open Working Hunter	Horse any height Jump height 3'6"

WORKING HUNTER CHAMPIONSHIP – CLASSES 18-22

All riders placed 1st or 2nd in any of these Working Hunter classes are invited to enter the Working Hunter Championship. This class is FREE to enter.

The judge will have a break at this point before the remaining Ridden Classes commence

* If you win class 18 or 19 at an early show in the season you may continue to enter this class for the rest of the season, but not in any subsequent season except as a non-competitor.

** Please note that Novice classes 18-20 are aimed at novice riders & combinations. Do feel free to enter as a non-competitor but please leave the novice classes for the genuine novice combinations

FOREIGN BREEDS (Classes 7 & 27): A Foreign Breed is one that is non-indigenous to the British Isles and excludes Irish horses and ponies. Some examples are: Andalusian, Appaloosa, Arab, American Saddlebred, Caspian, Falabella, Fjord, Friesian, Hafflinger, Icelandic, Lusitano, Lipizzaner, Iberian, Spanish, Morgan, Paso Fino, Quarter Horse, Rocky Mountain, Warmbloods.

Ridden Showing: RING 2 (FIELD) not before 12.30 pm

23) Ridden Hunter Type and Ridden Sports Horse	Horse any height
24) Ridden Mountain & Moorland	Horse any height. No spurs may be worn <i>(see list of eligible breeds above)</i>
25) Ridden Cob-type	Horse any height. Hogging not required
26) Ridden Coloured, Spotted & Palomino	Horse any height
27) Ridden Warmbloods, Rare & Foreign Breeds	any age / height <i>(see list of eligible breeds above)</i>
28) Best Riding Club Horse or Pony	Rider any age. Horse 4 years or over. Horse any height. You will be required to jump (max fence height 70cm / 2' 3")

AT THE END OF THE DAY, WHEN BOTH ARENAS HAVE FINISHED, RIDDEN SHOWING CHAMPIONSHIP – CLASSES 10-17 and 23-28

All riders placed 1st or 2nd in any of these ridden classes are invited to enter the Ridden Showing Championship. This class is FREE to enter.

Entries on the Day: Yes

Entry fees: Members £6, Non-members £9 plus £1 per rider for First Aid.

All classes must have a minimum of 4 entries in order to run.

We reserve the right to split large classes according to height of horse.

No late entries will be accepted once a class has commenced.

Please arrive promptly for your class to ensure that unnecessary delays do not occur.

In qualifying classes, 1st place to qualify but if 1st place has already qualified, the qualification may be passed down the line but to no lower than 4th place.
